
REGISTER NOW FOR SUMMER & FALL 2023!

Registration is now open for current families. To be assured a spot, return your registration form before we open registration to the public on Feb. $6^{\rm th}$. Classes fill quickly for both summer and fall sessions. Camp Lotta-Fun is open to children 3 yrs. (by 8/31 and toilet trained) through $3^{\rm rd}$ grade bound. Current families only pay a registration fee for our fall 2023 session.

4K PROGRAM FOR 2023-24

Wee Know School will continue to collaborate with the Kettle Moraine School District this fall. Families residing in the district boundaries can choose Wee Know for their 4K site. Private pay families may also enroll. Our class is led by a 4-yr. degreed teacher following a 1:10 teacher/child ratio. Extended care is available before and after the 4K program.

During the month of January, we turned our dramatic play into the arctic and went ice fishing! The children had lots of fun catching fish to cook on the outdoor grill! We also made some predictions to discover what happens to ice in different environments. For example, does ice melt faster in an open bowl or in a closed zip lock bag? We also graphed and talked about what animals do during the wintertime. Do they migrate, hibernate, or stay put? For art, we made snowmen, matching mitten prints, and snowflakes to decorate our classroom. In addition to our winter theme, we learned more about our community. We talked about the different places that can be found in a community and created a 3-D community of our own. Each child turned a box into a building. The children also had fun in our classroom post office making letters and pretending to mail them.
